#### **OUR MISSION**

The Toledo Cultural Arts Center, a non profit organization, produces and provides cultural and performing arts experiences for diverse audiences of all ages, to enhance the quality of the cultural and economic life of the City of Toledo, Lucas County, Northwestern Ohio and Southeast Michigan.

#### **OUR HISTORY**

The historic Valentine Theatre opened its doors on Christmas Day in 1895 and is currently a 901-seat facility operated by the Toledo Cultural Arts Center, Inc. After a 21year effort by the **Board of Trustees and** the community, the \$28 million renovation was unveiled on October 9, 1999. Since the Gala re-opening, more than a million people have attended international, national and area presentations, weddings and events.

t's hard to believe that our 20th season is almost over! What a tremendous year of theatre it has been with legendary shows *Chicago, Spamalot,* and *Rock of Ages* plus fan favorites *Legally Blonde,* Sandy Hackett's *The Rat Pack,* and *Bohemian Rhapsody.* Maureen McGovern gave a powerhouse performance backed by our very own Toledo Jazz All-Stars, and under-the-radar shows like *Choir of Man* were surprising treats. TV legends Barbara Eden and Hal Linden graced us with poignant performances in A.R. Gurney's *Love Letters.* Our popular theatre education program, Valentine School Days, brought professional productions of classic children's literature to more than 10,000 students in Northwest Ohio and Southeast Michigan, including nearly 5,000 low-income students who attended performances for free.

As we look forward to next season's exciting line-up, I want to take a minute to thank you for all you do to support this beautiful, historic theatre. Whether you are a donor, patron, volunteer or all of the above, our success is because of you. Year after year you choose to bring your time, talent and treasure to the Valentine Theatre and we are humbled by your steadfast generosity and loyalty. The Valentine Theatre is one of only a handful of historic theatres in Ohio which date from the 1890s, and your support keeps this grand old theatre looking beautiful. # **DATRON DROFILE:** Marilyn Irene Payne



Last year, the Valentine Theatre received a generous bequest from the estate of Marilyn Irene Payne, a longtime resident of Toledo and Sylvania. In appreciation, we asked Marilyn's dear friend, Linda Deubner, to share some of her memories of Marilyn.....

**Marilyn Irene Payne** was a Toledo native and truly proud of her home town and all that it offered to its citizens. She was intelligent and sociable with an independent streak, nurtured by her parents. Born on New Years Eve in 1930. She recalls her parent's delight at being seen by doctors in tuxedos, who were going to or coming from new years festivities. She always joked that she there was always a big celebration on her birthday.

**Family** Her parents were Albert and Irene Payne. Albert was a successful businessman and executive vice president of Tillotson Manufacturing Company. Irene was an accomplished seamstress and hatmaker, whose clientele included many of Toledo's socialites. Her style and fashion left an impression on Marilyn. Marilyn was an only child and had a very close relationship with her parents. The three of them were "the Payne's". They enjoyed the finer things in life together including annual trips to Florida. Their lifestyle was comfortable, not lavish. They believed in hard work, education, and service to the community. Marilyn took care of her mother until her mom died at 104.



The family lived originally on Vermont Street downtown. They attended St. Mark's Episcopal Church in the Old West End, where Marilyn was confirmed and active in Girl's Friendly Society. Marilyn remembered when all the action was downtown particularly the Valentine Theatre and shopping at Lamson's and Tiedtkes!

Later, the family moved to Old Orchard and eventually to a custom-built home in Sylvania township where they entertained frequently. Marilyn was an accomplished athlete and often played golf with her father at Sylvania Country Club, where she was also on the ladies' golf team.

**Education & Interests** Marilyn graduated from DeVilbiss High School in 1949, where she was on the swim team, golf team and bowling team. At Michigan State University she played golf on the Lady Spartan's team and was active in the theatre and drama club. Marilyn received a second degree in Teaching Early Childhood Education from the University of Toledo. Marilyn was a member of the Dendarah Shrine for over 25 years, played tennis and was in a bridge club. She enjoyed culture art, musicals, theater, fashion and didn't shy away from politics. She was proud to be an American and always had a flag flying at home. She had a soft spot for wounded military veterans.

*Family Legacy* Marilyn's legacy of generosity extended from her parents. Their trust and her trust created the bequests to the Valentine and other Toledo organizations.
