


ANNUAL REPORT 2020-2021

elcome to the 2020-2021 Valentine Theatre Annual Report

Our 2020-2021 Season will always be remembered as the season that wasn't. Unfortunately, the COVID-19 pandemic continued to wreak havoc throughout the world, and as a result, we made the difficult decision to keep our stage dark for the entire season. It was an extremely difficult decision, but one that was, absolutely in the best interest for the health and safety of our staff, volunteers, and patrons. Despite being closed, however, we continued to engage virtually with our patrons with new programming that showcased local artists and everyday citizens who have had an impact on our community. I am happy to say that the Valentine re-opened in September 2021 as we welcomed back the Toledo Opera and the Toledo Ballet to our Main Stage. It's been wonderful being back!

Looking back over the 2020-2021 season, we can point to several bright spots which helped keep up our morale during the difficult days of the pandemic. StoryTime at the Valentine is one of the most exciting programs we have created in recent years. The idea is to film local citizens reading books which reflect their work in the community or a personal passion. We partnered with Scholastic Books, Simon & Schuster, Dolly Parton's Imagination Library through Toledo's United Way. To date, 28 episodes of StoryTime have been filmed. Readers include civil servants, musical artists, current and former mayors of Toledo, physicians, veterinarians, attorneys, entertainers, and even Ohio's First Lady, Fran DeWine. Each episode is professionally produced by our very own Assistant Technical Director Joshua Smith and features closed-captioning and sign language interpretation.

Another new virtual series that was launched in Fall 2020 was Sessions. The stars of Sessions included THE Modern Dance Company performing No Love Lost; pianist Tony Pattin in Back in Toledo; opera soprano, Grace Wipfli, in Moments of Grace, and acoustic musical duo Denise Grupp-Verbon and Michael Grupp-Verbon of Tapestry. The virtual performances have been viewed more than 1,000 times!

Finally, we celebrated our 125th Anniversary in Broadway style with an intimate, virtual concert featuring Ana Gasteyer of SNL and Broadway fame and Broadway pianist Seth Rudetsky of SiriusXM's On Broadway. The virtual concert took place on Sunday, February 14, with Ana and Seth signing Broadway tunes and sharing hilarious backstage stories. We enjoyed the evening so much that we have invited Seth back for an in-person Gala in March 2022 with Vanessa Williams! We hope to see you there.

The past two years certainly have been difficult for so many of us, and we are incredibly grateful for your continued support of the beautiful historic Valentine Theatre. So many of you gave generously to Keep the Valentine Strong, and your gifts made all the difference. Today, I am happy to say that we are back to full capacity and looking forward to a strong 2021-2022 season. See you at the Theatre!

TOP 5 THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT THE VALENTINE



- The Toledo Cultural Arts Center at the Valentine Theatre is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit, arts organization whose mission is to produce and provide cultural and performing arts experiences for diverse audiences of all ages, and to enhance the quality of the cultural and economic life of the City of Toledo, Lucas County, Northwestern Ohio, and Southeastern Michigan. All donations to the Valentine are tax-deductible.
- Through Valentine School Days, Weekend Children's Series, and student performances by partner arts organizations, the Valentine enriches the lives of more than 15,000 children every year.
- The Valentine Theatre opened Christmas Day 1895. Today it presents national touring productions of Broadway shows, award-winning musical artists, up-and-coming productions, and \$5 classic movies in its 900-seat Main Stage as well as locally produced plays, dramatic readings, and monthly improv shows in its 100-seat intimate Black Box Studio A.
- The Valentine Theatre is the cultural hub of downtown Toledo, serving as the home stage for the Toledo Opera, Toledo Jazz Orchestra, Ballet Theatre of Toledo, and the venue of choice for the Toledo Symphony, Toledo Ballet, as well as area high schools and dozens of arts groups from throughout the region. Attendance is about 67,000 per year.
- The Historic Valentine Theatre is utilized as an event/wedding space. Its Grand Lobby, Historic Lobby, Founders Room, Studio A, and Main Theatre can be utilized for receptions, weddings, and corporate events.

- ▼ The Valentine Theatre was selected to receive a \$25,000 award from the Marathon Classic Foundation in support of StoryTime and Valentine School Days. This is the second time that the Valentine has received this highly competitive grant. Dozens of staff, volunteers, and board members volunteered their time to work at the golf outing in July.
- Despite being closed because of the COVID-19 Pandemic, the Valentine staff created hours of virtual programming which allowed us to continue to connect with our community.
- ▼ The Valentine staff filmed, edited and produced 28 episodes of our brand-new virtual educational program, StoryTime at the Valentine. Readers included Toledo Mayor Wade Kapszukiewicz, Merwin Siu of the Toledo Symphony, Veterinarian Dr. John Dillon, Ballet Theatre of Toledo's Nigel Burgoine, and Ohio's First Lady Fran DeWine, among many others.
- ▼ The Valentine Theatre was awarded a \$200,000 capital grant from the State of Ohio to replace our aging chillers. The new chillers were installed in May 2021.
- ▼ The Valentine Theatre received a generous \$50,000 matching grant award made possible by the Gorski and Kervin families.
- ▼ The Valentine Theatre won the 2021 Greater Toledo Community Foundation's Innovation Award in recognition of StoryTime and Sessions.
- ▼ The Valentine was awarded a COVID Resiliency grant from the Greater Toledo Community Foundation in support of Sessions.






OPERATING REVENUE BY SOURCE—FY 2021

ECONOMIC IMPACT


Based on the calculator developed by the Americans for the Arts, the economic impact of the Valentine Theatre is significant.
