

#### elcome to the 2022-2023 Valentine Theatre Annual Report

The Valentine Theatre's 24th Season kicked off early with the Toledo Opera's Blue in August. In September the Ohio Arts Professionals Network (OAPN) held their annual 3-day conference at the Valentine. Dozens of artists from across the country were showcased during the conference. It was a wonderful networking experience for local aritsts and agents, and we hope OAPN will return for future conferences. Our presenting season included several sold-out performances, including The Simon & Garfunkel Story, Jim Brickman,'s A Very Merry Christmas, Scared Scriptless with Colin Mochrie and Brad Sherwood, and several Valentine School Days performances,. Additional highlights of the season included American Ballet Theatre Studio, RBG, Pirates of Penzance, and Broadway legend Patti Lupone's stellar performance at our annual Heart to Heart Gala.









CERTIFIED AUTISM CENTER

The Valentine expanded its accessibility to patrons when it became one of the first oganizations in downtown Toledo to be designated a Certified Autism Center by the International Board of Credentialing and Continuing Education Standards (IBCCES). Our full-time staff and many of our volunteers have completed specialized training in how to respond appropriately to patrons with Autism, Autism Spectrum Disorder and sensory sensitivities. In Fall 2022 we received a \$25,000 grant from the Greater Toledo Community Foundation to pilot our new Sensory-Friendly Series. The response from the community has been overwhelmingly positive.

### Saying Goodbye after 13 Seasons...

Finally, I want to thank the staff and board of the Valentine, our arts partners, patrons, sponsors, donors, and community for making my 13 seasons here at the Valentine Theatre such a lovely experience. I truly loved working here and will miss all of you very much! I'm so proud of all we were able to accomplish over the years — creating and expanding Valentine School Days so thousands of school children can experience the magic of seeing their favorite storybooks come to life; fulfilling the Valentine's mission to be a true community arts center by renewing and fostering relationships with community arts groups; and ensuring the theatre's continued sustainability through increased grants funding, donations, and community usage. Although our doors were closed for 18 months during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, our staff worked diligently to secure government grants to maintain operations. But, we didn't stop there...we also continued to innovate with creative virtual programming like Sessions, which showcased local artists, musicians, and dancers, and StoryTime, which expanded our educational outreach to school children and helped forge a much-needed sense of community. All throughout my time at the Valentine, so many of you have shown me such kindness and support for which I am truly thankful and humbled. In September 2023, more than 150 community leaders, friends and family gathered to commemorate my retirement and welcome my successor, Abby Glanville. I first met Abby in 2018 and was immediately impressed with her poise, professionalism, and thoughtful leadership. She has an impressive background in the arts as well as a masters degree in historic preservation, which makes her perfectly suited for leading the Valentine. Like me, she has a passion for arts education outreach, and I'm confident she will continue to ensure everyone has access to this beautiful gem of a theatre and all of its amazing programs. I hope you will welcome her and show her the same kindness and support I have always enjoyed.



# TOP 5 THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT THE VALENTINE



- The Toledo Cultural Arts Center at the Valentine Theatre is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit, arts organization whose mission is to produce and provide cultural and performing arts experiences for diverse audiences of all ages, and to enhance the quality of the cultural and economic life of the City of Toledo, Lucas County, Northwestern Ohio, and Southeastern Michigan. All donations to the Valentine are tax-deductible.
- Through Valentine School Days, Weekend Children's Series, and student performances by partner arts organizations, the Valentine enriches the lives of more than 15,000 children every year.
- The Valentine Theatre opened Christmas Day 1895. Today it presents national touring productions of Broadway shows, award-winning musical artists, up-and-coming productions, and \$5 classic movies in its 900-seat Main Stage as well as locally produced plays, dramatic readings, and monthly improv shows in its 100-seat intimate Black Box Studio A.
- The Valentine Theatre is the cultural hub of downtown Toledo, serving as the home stage for the Toledo Opera, Toledo Jazz Orchestra, Ballet Theatre of Toledo, and the venue of choice for the Toledo Symphony, Toledo Ballet, as well as area high schools and dozens of arts groups from throughout the region. Attendance is about 67,000 per year.
- The Historic Valentine Theatre is also utilized as an event space. Its Grand Lobby, Historic Lobby, Founders Room, Studio A, and Main Theatre can host receptions, alumni reunions, and corporate events.

- ♥ The Valentine Theatre received a \$100,000 CARES grant from the City of Toledo and Lucas County via the Toledo Arts Commission. This is the first installment of a 3-year award. Funding will be used to offset operational costs and help ensure the theatre's longterm sustainability.
- ♥ The Valentine received a \$25,000 CARES sub-grant from the National Endowment of the Arts through the Toledo Arts Commission to help offset operational costs.
- ♥ The Toledo Community Foundation awarded the Valentine \$25,000 to pilot a Sensory-Friendly Family Series for individuals with Autism, Autism Spectrum Disorder and/or sensory sensitivities.
- ♥ The Valentine offered complimentary tickets to 3,752 low-income students from Toledo Public Schools and other Title I Schools to attend Valentine School Days.
- ♥ Attendance at a Valentine Theatre performance or event increased 50% from last year to 49,764, including more than 7,500 students who attended Valentine School Days.
- ♥ We hosted 84 performances on our Main Stage, 18 events, and main theatre usage was more than 90% of available dates
- ♥ Glass City Improv presented more than 124 classes and performances in Studio A.






#### **OPERATING REVENUE BY SOURCE—FY 2023**

# ECONOMIC IMPACT


Based on the calculator developed by the Americans for the Arts, the economic impact of the Valentine Theatre is significant.
