





A Peek Behind the Curtain A Conversation with Marketing Director, Matt Lentz



People often ask me "how do you select shows for The Valentine?" My answer is always a combination of things that includes: one or two trips to New York City to see what's playing and eventually touring;

attending the APAP (Association of Performing Arts Professionals) conference annually, also in New York City; experiencing artist showcases and performances; along with staying in tune with what's happening in the world of performing arts nationally and internationally.

At The Valentine, we offer a diverse array of entertainment from ballet/dance, music, comedy, children's theatre to classic and current Broadway theatre, so it's paramount to keep up with trade publications and the pulse of an arts-and-entertainment hungry community. The next step is finding available dates in our already busy calendar full of local performing arts groups, and schools and private events. The Valentine is many things to many people; we are booked, busy and humming well over 200 days per year.

The most difficult part of the puzzle is fitting shows into that busy schedule when they are nearby. Why nearby you ask? It's important in the negotiation of fees for most presentations to book in a "routed" fashion, meaning scheduling when they are playing other cities in

Ohio, Michigan or Indiana. Scheduling "routed" dates allows for fine-tuning fees and travel costs, making it possible for us to afford productions that might be prohibitively expensive if we brought them in from either coast or internationally.

Selecting shows for our season is not terribly complicated after doing it for so many years. Time and experience familiarizes one with the premiere booking agencies in the country and builds relationships with their representatives. It's frustrating at times, finding

time to present in a busy venue like ours, but it's also creative, fun and exciting and rewarding once they are here and the



audience is on their feet applauding the artistry and talent of the musicians, dancers, actors and performers on our Valentine stage.

Looking ahead to our 20th Season, we are currently in negotiations for Broadway shows *Chicago*, *Legally Blonde* and *Rock of Ages* along with musical presentations from The Rat Pack to Gilbert & Sullivan's *Mikado*...fingers crossed. Look for our website and Blade announcement in May!
