
OUR MISSION


OUR HISTORY

The historic Valentine Theatre opened its doors on Christmas Day in 1895 and is currently a 901-seat facility operated by the Toledo Cultural Arts Center, Inc. Following a 21year effort by the Board of Trustees and the community, the newly renovated theatre was reopened on October 9, 1999. Since then, more than a million people have attended international, national and regional presentations, weddings and events.






We're Ready for our Closeup!

We are sprucing up the house to welcome you back in style!

Although our doors have been closed for more than 14 months, we have been busy behind the scenes getting the theatre ready for re-opening. We recently replaced the old chillers on our roof with brand-new energy efficient models which will save us thousands of dollars in cooling costs each year. This

capital improvement was made possible by a generous grant from the State of Ohio. Facilities Manager Bill Colter along with Jori Jex, Matt Lentz, and Tim Durham were on-site early one Saturday morning to watch as crews used an 80-foot crane to remove the old chillers (each weighing 12 tons!) and hoist the new ones onto the roof of the Valentine. Assistant Tech Director Josh Smith filmed the entire operation, and the edited video will be posted to our website soon.

We also upgraded components of our boiler thanks to a generous grant award from the Lucas County Commissioners. And, we're giving Studio A a long overdue makeover — painting the walls, adding new seating, improving traffic flow, and refurbishing the refreshment/bar area.

We are grateful to the state of Ohio, the Lucas County Commissioners, our state and local representatives, and to our board members for recognizing the value of these capital improvements and the importance of investing in downtown Toledo. We can't wait to welcome you back to






THE STARS OF SESSIONS



THE Modern Dance Company, founded in 2017 to celebrate the human experience and headquartered in Toledo, celebrates diverse cultures and dance styles. In this Session, the Company presents "No Love Lost" and you'll get an exclusive behind-the-scenes look at what goes in to staging a dance show — rehearsing, spacing dancers, choosing colors for lighting, etc.

Soprano Grace Wipfli is a resident artist of the Toledo Opera. Miss Wipfli grew up in Toledo and recently received a Master of Music in Voice and Opera Performance from the Bienen School of Music at Northwestern University. In this Session, she performs arias from Debussy's "L'Enfant Pordigue" and Mozart's "Don Gionvanni", as well as Broadway favorite "My White Knight" from Music Man. She is accompanied by pianist Kevin Bylsma.





Toledo native Dr. Anthony Pattin recently returned home after 32 years in Birmingham, Alabama where he was a distinguished Professor of Music at the University of Montevallo. He has performed as soloist with orchestras, including the Toledo Symphony, performed three solo piano recitals in New York (1998,2002,2006) including two in Weil Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall. He has had three concert tours in Tokyo, Japan (2006,2008,2018). He is a chamber musician, and serves as pianist and judge for the Most Arts Festival and Competition (Alfred University, NY) adjudicator, scholar and lecturer, and is also a skilled arranger and improvisor. In this Session, Mr. Pattin performs music of Brahms, Rachmaninoff, and Gershwin.

Toledo's own Tapestry includes Harpist, Denise Grupp-Verbon and Acoustic Guitarist/Multi-Instrumentalist, Michael Grupp-Verbon. Performing and recording together for more than 11 years, Denise and Michael have created a truly distinctive sound, with their unique arranging & composing, and by the intertwining of different instruments. In this Session, Tapestry plays many different styles of music from Celtic & Folk to Pop, Classical, and more.

He bartended for nearly two decades at the Valentine and for years was Events Manager Dan Heberling's right-hand man. Not long after losing Rob, we lost Pam Stahl, another longtime bartender. Pam was a social butterfly who worked events at the Huntington Center and Fifth Third Field, but loved the Valentine. She often brought in homemade cookies and treats for the staff and volunteers. She genuinely cared about the people she worked with. Finally, we remember Doris Jones, a gentle soul who started volunteering as an usher with us in 2017. She and her dear friend Billie Lothery always volunteered together. Rob, Pam, and Doris were well-loved members of our Valentine family whose service and dedication were an inspiration to us all. They will be greatly missed indeed.
